### Primary School

Primary students benefit from learning English, Mathematics, International Primary Curriculum (IPC: enquiry-based, cross-curricular Science, Geography and History units) and 'Values' lessons with their Class Teachers. Their classroom environment presents a nurturing focus on effective learning routines and skills and social development. This core curriculum is enriched by lessons with subjections specialists in Art, French and Mandarin, Music, Nigerian and African Studies, Physical Education & swimming and STEM.

These lessons take place in purpose-built learning areas and ensure an excellent learning platform of knowledge, skills and understanding in preparation for the transition up to secondary school.

The whole academic programme is underpinned by the Pastoral Platform, our range of programmes, events and activities that support student wellbeing and personal and character development, and a sense of belonging and identity.

These include Healthy Lifestyle lessons in Values, IPC and Physical Education lessons, access to the Medical Centre and School Counsellor, the School House and 'Leadership Ladder' structures as well as the Charterhouse Lagos Character Education Model.





At Charterhouse Lagos, we are committed to developing the whole student through a broad, engaging, and globally-minded secondary education. In Key Stage 3, our curriculum blends the rigour of the English National Curriculum (ENC) with the inquiry-led approach of the International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC), designed to deepen knowledge and promote real-world connections.

Our approach places strong emphasis on critical thinking, independence, and leadership. Key Stage 3 is not simply a stepping stone to IGCSEs and A Levels—It is the foundation on which students begin to flourish. These are the years where ambition is nurtured, character is formed, and each learner starts to shape their own future.

Students study a wide range of subjects, including English Language and Literature, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, French, and Mandarin. This core is enhanced with specialist teaching in STEM, World and African Literature, Physical Education, and Swimming, as well as an innovative Personal, Social, Health and Education (PSHE) curriculum.

Our Charterhouse Lagos values programme also plays a central role—encouraging students to form meaningful connections with the local community, explore their interests, and take part in purposeful service. This not only enriches their learning but prepares them to become active, responsible global citizens with a lifelong love of learning.



## IGCSE (Years 10 & 11)

At Charterhouse Lagos, Key Stage 4 (KS4) spans Years 10 and 11, for students aged 14 to 16. During this phase, students prepare for their IGCSE (International General Certificate of Secondary Education) qualifications—globally recognised and academically rigorous. These exams are typically taken at the end of Year 11 and form the foundation for progression to A Level study in the Sixth Form.

All students follow a structured academic pathway designed to offer both breadth and depth. English Language and English Literature are mandatory and together count as two IGCSEs.

Mathematics is also compulsory, alongside at least two science subjects chosen from Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. These core areas ensure that students build strong foundations in literacy, numeracy, and scientific reasoning.

In addition to the core, students select three or four elective subjects, depending on their interests, strengths, and long-term aspirations. These options may include History, Geography, French, Mandarin Chinese, Computer Science, Art, Music, and Business Studies.

The goal is to allow students to pursue both traditional academic routes and creative or technical disciplines. Elective subjects are offered based on student interest and staffing availability.

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) remains a vital part of the curriculum, supporting students' well-being, digital citizenship, and future planning, Physical Education (PE) is compulsory but not assessed for IGCSE, focusing instead on health, teamwork, and physical fitness.

Most students at Charterhouse Lagos will complete eight or nine IGCSEs by the end of Year 11. Exams typically take place between May and June, with results released in August. This well-rounded and forward-looking programme ensures each student is equipped for the challenges and opportunities of A Level study and beyond.





#### A Levels (Years 12 & 13)

Sixth Form encompasses Years 12 and 13, typically for students aged 16 to 18. During this phase, students undertake A Levels (IAL), globally recognised qualifications that are widely accepted by top universities around the world.


The A Level programme is divided into two stages. In Year 12, students study for their AS Level (Advanced Subsidiary), typically selecting four subjects, including the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which is completed alongside their academic subjects. In Year 13, students continue with three A2 Level subjects, chosen from their original four, to complete the full A Level qualification.

The EPQ is a valuable part of the Sixth Form experience. It enables students to research a topic of personal interest in depth, resulting in a report, artefact, or performance. Equivalent to half an A Level, it develops academic writing, research skills, and critical thinking, and contributes to UCAS points—highly regarded by universities.

Assessment is based on performance across both stages, with AS Levels graded from A to E and full A Levels graded from A\* to E. Exams are usually held in May and June, with results released in August.

Likely subject offerings will include Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, History, Geography, Business Studies, Computer Science, French, English Literature, Art, and Music. Choices are made in consultation with academic staff to ensure alignment with university and career goals.

Throughout Sixth Form, students are supported by our Careers and Higher Education Guidance team, who offer tailored advice on subject selection, university applications, personal statements, and interviews. Using platforms such as Unifrog and maintaining links with leading global universities, the team ensures that every student is well-prepared for the next stage of their academic journey.



Boarding: Where every student finds a second home

Opening in September 2025, our purpose-built boarding houses—Toddites for boys and Hencherites for girls—offer a safe, supportive, and enriching environment where students grow, thrive, and form lifelong friendships.

Each room accommodates up to four students, with high-quality beds, study desks, storage, and private ensuite bathrooms. All rooms are air-conditioned for year-round comfort.

Facilities are designed for both academic focus and relaxation. Students enjoy a TV lounge with foosball, the Rotunda for quiet reflection, and a computer and gaming room with Xbox and PSS. Study rooms, a counsellor's office, and a 'Buttery' kitchenette with a pantry and dining area complete the well-equipped houses. All areas are fitted with safety and emergency lighting.





Student wellbeing is central to the boarding experience. Resident Houseparents and Tutors provide daily mentoring, academic guidance, and supervised Prep (homework). A qualified counsellor is on-site, and all staff are trained in safeguarding. Three nutritious meals are served daily, and students may bring snacks from home.


