The curriculum has been designed so that every individual student can progress at a pace that is appropriate to their ability and specific learning needs. As they grow, students will participate

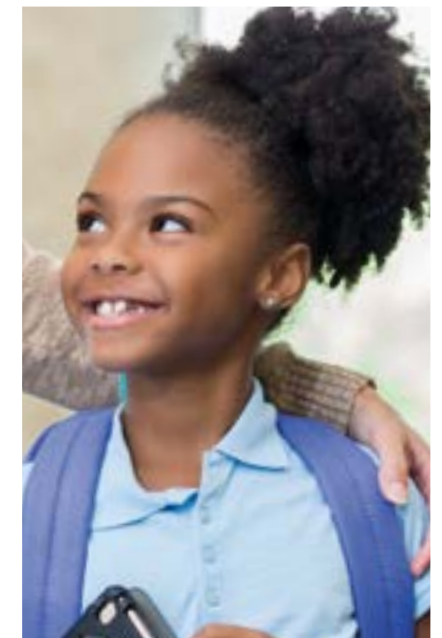
in a number of school-based programmes to help develop their critical thinking and communication skills, as well as life skills and physical education.

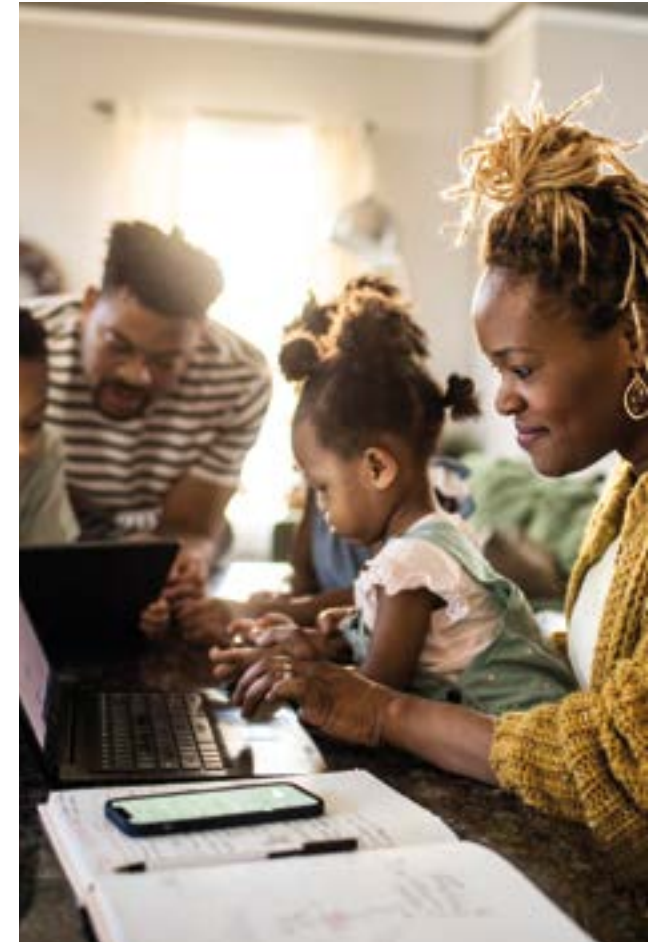
Building on our philosophy of providing space to grow, we also ensure children are presented with opportunities to explore their passions and expand their horizons.

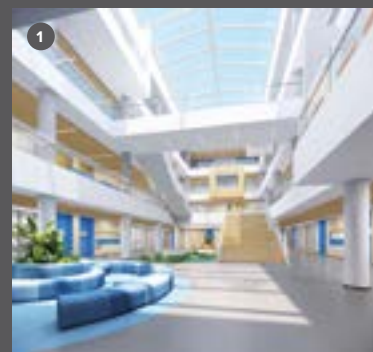

Registration

Complete the online registration form, available on our website, and pay the accompanying registration fee.

2

Application

Complete the online application form, pay the accompanying application fee, and submit the following supporting documentation.

- Birth certificate
- Recent passport-sized colour photograph
- Copy of receipt of payment for application fee (if payment not made online)
- Copy of bio-data page from international passport
- Immunization card/record
- Report from most recent term at child's immediate previous school (where appropriate)

Assessment

Our Admissions department will arrange for a formal assessment to take place, with the potential for overseas candidates to be assessed at their current school on application.

For children applying to the Primary School, assessment involves an evaluation of English and Mathematics competency, and is designed to ensure students can fully access the curriculum. Children applying to Years 1 and 2 will also meet with a teacher or the Head of Primary, and may be asked to undertake a more informal assessment process.

4

Review

Individual admissions are assessed by the admitting Head of Primary School or Head of Middle School.

5

Outcome

There are three potential outcomes to the admissions process:

- The application is accepted and a conditional place is offered. Places are only confirmed when the first year's fees are paid in full.
- The application is accepted but no places are currently available. The applicant can choose to be placed on the waiting list.
- The application is rejected. The student is able to re-apply for a place after six months.

Here you will find details of how to secure a place for your child at Charterhouse Lagos. We employ a five-step admissions process, which enables families and the school to get to know each other, and ensures children will thrive within our school environment.
